

# Pte. Charles Eales

Charles was the third child of seven, born in Bugbrooke to Charles and Catherine Eales. In 1911, Charles was living and working in Northampton as an assistant dairyman. Living at 19 Harley Street, Coventry with his parents and working as a milkman at the start of the war. Enlisted 9<sup>th</sup> October 1916 in the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Northamptonshire Regiment, as Pte 7089. His medical showed him to be 5ft 4ins, with a 37 inch chest. Served in France from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1917 to the 11<sup>th</sup> April 1917. He was shot in the right shoulder on the 11<sup>th</sup> April, and served the remainder of the war in the agricultural company of the Labour Corps. in Northampton, as Pte 546153. Died from Influenza and Pneumonia on the 7<sup>th</sup> November 1918, and is buried in the Towcester Rd. Cemetery in Northampton. His brother Frederick also served in the Great War and was also killed. On transfer to the Labour Corps, his papers state he had the following brothers also serving - W Eales, John Eales, and George Eales.
