 He volunteered in September 1914, and twelve months later proceeded to the Western Front, where he saw much severe fighting. He was unfortunately reported missing, and is now believed to have been killed in action at Loos on September 27th, 1915, less than four weeks after landing in France. He was entitled to the 1914-15 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals.
