The 8th of 10 children born to James and Edith, the father James, was a joiner of private means.

Joined up in 1917 to the Kings Own Rifle Corps no.45383, later transferred to the 12th Battalion City of London Regiment(The Royal Fusiliers). This was disbanded in February 1918, and soldiers transferred to 1st, 10th or 11th battalions. It looks like MGJ transferred to the 11th as they later fought at Amiens. However his grave records him as belonging to the Kings Own Rifle Corps.

Killed 9th August 1918, the second day of the battle of Amiens. Buried at Beacon Cemetery, Saily Laurette. A memorial to Marmaduke and Fred Joyce, is located in the Bugbrooke Chapel, though not actively displayed.
