Walter was the fourth child of seven, born in Bugbrooke to Charles and Catherine Eales. The family had moved to Bramcote Hill, Nuneaton by 1911, where father and son were working on a farm.

He initially served with the Royal Warwickshire Regiment as Private 18938, and later was a private number 34031 in the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry.

He was killed on 23rd April 1917, in the Western European Theatre, and is listed on the Arras Memorial, and was awarded the British and Victory medals.

His brother Charles also served and died while serving in England in 1919.
