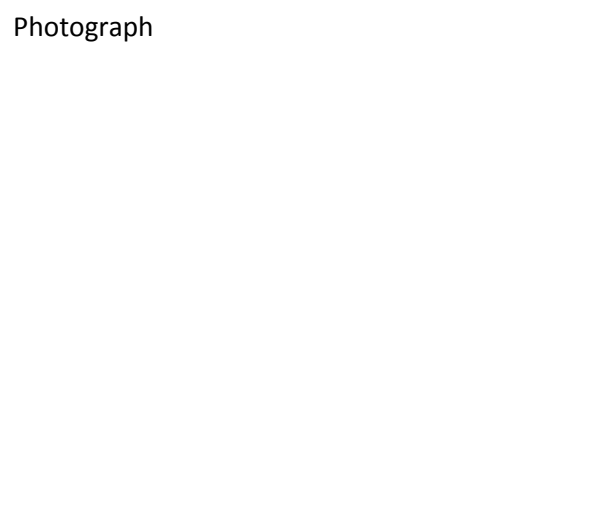

Albert was born in Bugbrooke, the son of Thomas and Mary Billingham. He was one of three brothers to enlist. He joined the Territorials on the 28th October 1914 and transferred to the Northamptonshire Regiment (initial service No. 2912, final service No. 31046). He served in the British Expeditionary Force in France, then in the Mediterranean and finally in Egypt. On the 13th April 1917 he was assessed as suffering from shell shock and declared no longer physically fit. On his discharge papers it stated that he was "sober, steady and well conducted" and that he is "discharged owing to effect of active service."
