EALES, A. A., Sapper, Royal Engineers,

He volunteered in June 1915, and in September was drafted to the Eastern theatre of war. After serving in Egypt for a time he was transferred to Palestine, and was engaged on special railway work during the operations at Gaza, Jerusalem, Jaffa and along the Jordan. He was demobilised in April 1919 and holds the 1914-15 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals.
