## Additional Information

Charles HARRISON's family history is unclear, but shortly before the war he was living in Bugbrooke with his spinster Aunt (aged 47) and working as an agricultural labourer.

He enlisted, or was conscripted, into the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry as a private soldier, initially numbered 4301, later renumbered 26666. He served in France, probably with the 1/4<sup>th</sup> (Territorial Force) Battalion, which had landed at Boulogne on 30 March 1915.

He survived the Western Front unscathed and qualified for the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

Any marriage and his death have not been traced.

## Family notes:

A Charles HARRISON's birth was registered in Northampton in the third quarter of 1881.

According to the 1891 Census, a Charles HARRISON aged 9 was living in Northampton with his grandparents William CORE and Elizabeth CORE (née POOLE); they had at least five children, including Mary Poole CORE, born in the second quarter of 1863 in Bugbrooke (the Aunt with whom he was living in 1911?).

According to the 1901 Census, a Charles HARRISON was living in Kettering with his brother-in-law Amos MURKITT and wife Susan (née HARRISON); Amos and Susan married in the last quarter of 1898 in Kettering.

It is possible that Charles's mother was a sister of his Aunt Mary, or Mary herself. (She was resident in a Convalescent Home in Cornwall at the time of the 1891 Census.
