Additional Information

David MOORE was born in Bugbrooke where his father was the licensee at *The Five Bells*. His mother had died in late 1910 and in early 1911 he was boarding with a family in Essex and working as Butcher's manager.

He enlisted in 7th Battalion, the Northamptonshire Regiment on 14 September 1914, giving his employment as 'Butcher'. This battalion was the unit of volunteers raised by well-known rugby player Edgar Mobbs and was known unofficially as 'Mobbs Own'. Mobbs himself was eventually commissioned and commanded the battalion for a time later in France and was killed in action on 31 July 1917.

David, number 15629, was posted to 'D' Company and promoted Sergeant on 28 September. However, he was soon deemed medically unfit for military service and was discharged on 9 October 1914.

He did not qualify for any war service medals.
