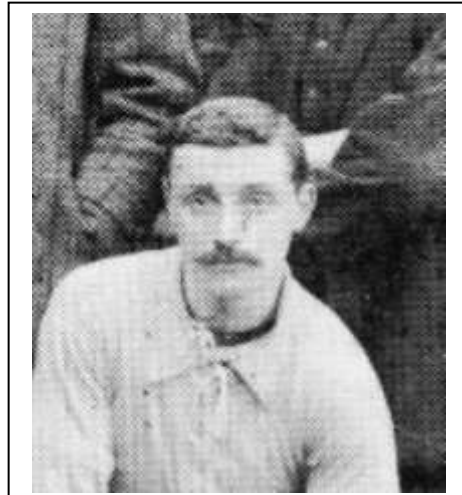

Information from National Roll of the Great War

Pte 21826 Regiment AOC. Then Reg. No. 0/52346 regiment RAOC

In 1891 Edgar was 5 living with his parents, brother Charles aged 20, and sister Annie aged 14. He was a scholar with Charles working with his father as a plumber/glazier. They were living next to the Five Bells on Church Lane.

In 1901 Edgar was 15 living with his parents and sister Annie, and working with his father as a plumber/glazier. They were living next to the Five Bells on Church Lane.

In 1911, he was aged 25, still living at home with his parents, and Charles who was by then a widower. Annie was no longer at home. They had a visitor staying with them Florence Parrott. On this census, it states Henry and Ann had 4 living children and one who had died.

Edgars death is registered in Northampton in June 1953. He was aged 67.

In the WW1 Service Medal and Awards Roll, he is referred to as Pte 052346 of the Royal Ordinance Company, and previously Pte SE21826 RAVC(Royal Army Veterinary Corps). SE here means Special Enlistment for the duration of the war, mainly used with the RAVC. He was transferred to the Z Reserve on the 3rd December 1919.
