He volunteered in January 1915, and four months later was drafted to India, where he served on the North-West Frontier. Later he was transferred to Mesopotamia and took part in much fighting at Kut, Baghdad, and on the River Tigris. He returned home and was demobilised in March 1919, holding the 1914-15 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals.

Fred was born in Bugbrooke in around 1895 one of four children. His father, Henry Eli Tarry was a shepherd in the village and Fred was a farmer's lad at the age of 16 in 1911.

He enlisted in January 1915 and joined the 2<sup>nd</sup> Norfolk Regiment with Service Number 23695. His service in India and Middle East is shown in the box above.

He was entitled to the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.
