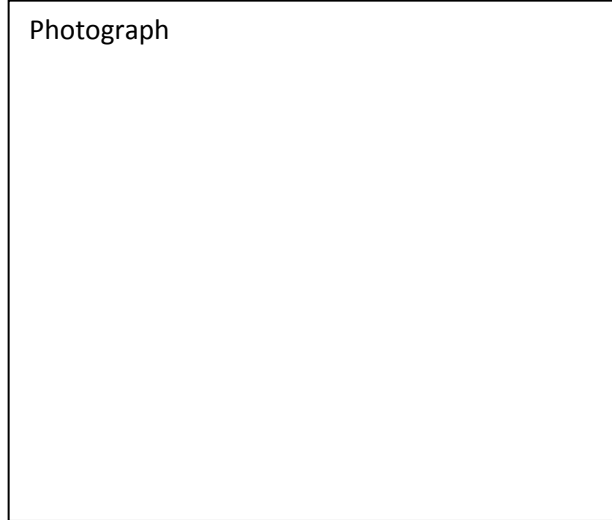

Information

In 1911, George was living in Bugbrooke aged 20, with his parents and brother Andrew, who was also 20. The family had had 11 children of which 6 had died by 1911. On the 1891 census, George and Andrew were given as 6 month old twins.

Frank enlisted in April 1915 in London as a Sapper in the Royal Engineers, Regimental No. 295706. After training, he embarked on 31st July 1915, and served in Salonica as a platelayer in the Railway Corps until 1919. He was known to the army as a sober, reliable, hard working man. He was discharged from 1/7 Railway Company BSF PR4047 in March 1919 with no disability. Frank and his twin Andrew were both in the Railway Corps of the Royal Engineers and both survived the war.

He was mentioned in dispatches of LieutGeneral Sir Gervase Milne Vide LG d/5.6.19 no. 31385
