

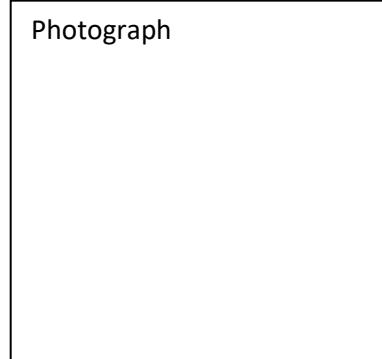

<i>Additional Information</i>

George TURLAND was one of the two children of George TURLAND, a horse 'helper' on a farm, and his wife Elizabeth.

No evidence of military service has been confirmed. No relevant service record has been found; there are Medal Index Cards for a number of 'George' or 'G' TURLAND, but no 'George William', 'George W' or 'GW'.

George married Maud WATSON in 1925, but sadly she died in late 1933 at the early age of 31. George married again, Kate WILLIAMS, seven years his junior, in autumn 1938.

In 1939, George and Kate were living in Nuneaton, where George was employed as a labourer on railway engineering maintenance.

George died on 21 February 1981 and Kate on 16 January 1986, with a home address on Camp Hill. They are remembered on dated memorial 207 in Bugbrooke churchyard (with George's parents at undated memorial 65).
