Information

Joined the Army Reserve, 11th December 1915, mobilized to the Scots Guards no 15819 on 27th June 1916 at that time living at 94 Hood Street, Northampton. Height 6ft 2 ins, 40 inch chest. Wounded in action 19th October 1917.

He served on the Home front 27th June 1916 to 9th August 1917. Appointed Lance Corporal 12th Feb. 1917

British Expeditionary Force in France 9th August 1917 to 20th October 1917 (wounded, shot in the leg. 35 days in hospital in Llandudno)

Home front 21st October 1917 to 30th March 1918. Disembarked to join regiment in France 31st March 1918. Promoted to Corporal 16th May 1918. 28th August 1918. injured in the face and arm, evacuated to England, 71 days in army hospital London)

Returned to Regiment with British Expeditionary Force 20th March 1918 to 9th February 1919.

Demobilised on the 9th February 1919, and transferred to Class Z Army Reserve. Home address at that time given as Bugbrooke.
