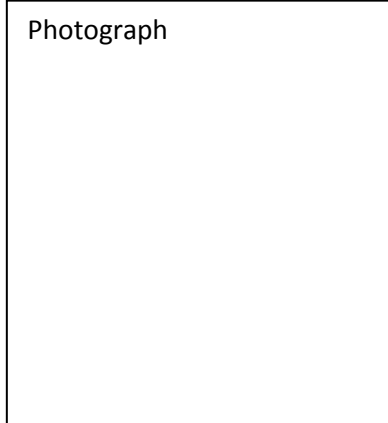

<i>Additional Information</i>

Herbert was one of seven children of William ROBINS, a farm labourer, and his wife Sarah Ann.

He enlisted/was conscripted into the Royal Engineers (RE) in 1915 and was selected for employment on railway duties, numbered 88174 as a private soldier (Sapper in the RE). He was posted to 115 Railway Company, RE, and went to France on 3 September 1915. At some stage he was re-numbered WR/289151 ('WR' denoting employment on 'Waterways & Railways' duties).

He qualified for the 1914-15 Star, the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

Herbert died in March 1958 and his widow, Eveline, lived-on until June 1991.
