Information

A Squad Yeomanry, Private 3538. Discharged 1917 after foot amputated.

Joined the Northamptonshire Yeomanry, no. 584, a territorial force, on the 17th March 1911 for a term of 4 years, whilst a farm labourer living in Staverton. On enlistment, he was 18years 11months, 5ft 10ins in height with a 37 inch chest. His physical condition was described as satisfactory.

Became part of the regular army on the outbreak of war, 5th August 1914. Served in France as part of the Expeditionary Force, from 5th November 1914, to 20th January 1916. Discharged 14th August 1917 on medical grounds.

At the end of his 4 year term, he re-enlisted on the 8th December 1915 for a further 4 year term, or the end of the war if earlier.

Awarded the British War Medal, The Victory Medal and the 1914 Star.
