Additional Information

Joseph was one of a large Bugbrooke family. His father, Joseph was a farm labourer. In 1901 they were living in Collin's Yard but by 1911 they had moved to Chapel Yard.

Joseph's brothers George and Thomas also joined up, but only Joseph joined the Royal Engineers as a sapper with Service No. 255787. His service record was one of many that were destroyed by fire in the Second World War and so we do not know when he joined up. His Medal Roll Index Card show him entitled to the British War Medal and the Victory Medal and he was recorded on the absent voters list in 1918 and so was demobilised sometime after the war ended. His final Service No. was W/R 280686 which indicated that he served in the railway or waterway construction or maintenance.
