He volunteered in January 1915, and in July of the following year was sent to Salonika, where he was engaged chiefly in conveying supplies to the forward areas on the Struma, Vardar and Doiran fronts. In December 1918 he was transferred to South Russia for transport duties and, returning home in August 1919, was demobilised in the following month. He holds the General Service and Victory Medals.

Additional Information

Thomas was born in Bugbrooke in about 1885 one of eleven children of Joseph and Betsy. In 1901 they were living in Collins Yard in Bugbrooke and Thomas was working as a farm labourer.

In 1910 Thomas married Christiania Rebecca Grant (daughter of Thomas Grant the owner of the Bugbrooke Threshing Machine). By the following year Thomas and Christiania were living at Lodge House, Kislingbury Fields.

Thomas joined up in January 1915 in the Army supply Corps as a driver – Service Number T4/044952. He was promoted to Lance Corporal and his service is summarized in the box above. He was entitled to the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.
