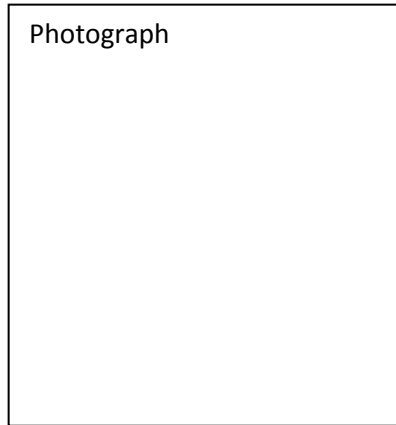

<i>Additional Information</i>

Arthur GILKES was one of eight surviving children of John GILKES, a Master Sawyer, and his wife Hannah. (Hannah died on 24 July 1909, John on 15 September 1916).

Arthur's exact military service is unconfirmed – he was possibly a Gunner (Private) in the Royal Field Artillery, no. 203664, who earned the British War Medal and the Victory Medal for service on the Western Front, or a private in the Army Veterinary Corps, no. SE3439, who earned the 1914-15 Star, the British War Medal and the Victory Medal, also for service on the Western Front.

Arthur died on 5 March 1954 in Northants; his widow Emily died on 15 April 1962, aged 80. They are both commemorated on a family 'kerb' tablet in St Michael & All Angels churchyard, numbered 113.
