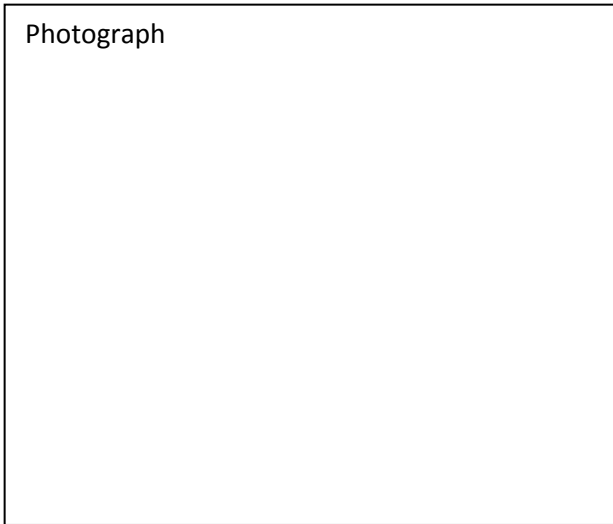

Before the war Arthur was a journeyman carpenter living in Bugbrooke.

Arthur enlisted on the 9th September 1914 and joined the East Surrey regiment and was at Purfleet Camp before joining the British Expeditionary Force by 27/07/1915.

In June 1918 he transferred to the Labour Corps and the following year to the Royal Engineers as a Sapper. He was demobilized on 3rd March 1920 and holds the 1914-15 Star.

The military papers record his uncle E Robins of the Sunday School House as being his next of kin and also list his sister, Mrs Nightingale.

Arthur's middle name is variously recorded as Edward or Edwin.
