**BUBB, C., Corporal, Australian Imperial Forces.**  
 He volunteered in Australia in October 1914, and was drafted to France in July of the following year. Whilst on the Western Front he took part in severe fighting in the Battles of Ypres, Loos, Albert, the Somme and Cambrai, and in the Retreat and Advance of 1918. He was wounded in 1915, and again in 1917, being sent to England for treatment on each occasion. Demobilised in December 1919, he holds the 1914-15 Star, and the General Service and Victory Medals.

Additional Information

In 1891 census, born and living in Gayton aged 6.

In 1901 census, living in Camp Hill Cottages, Bugbrooke. A carter on a farm. States born Banbury Lane.

On 14<sup>th</sup> May 1909, a Chas Bubb (clerk) travelled to Australia on the ship Ormuz. He volunteered whilst in Australia.

In 1915, a Charles Bubb, born 1885, embarked at part of the Australian Imperial Force, being in the 8<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade, no.897. Ship was HMAT A2, Keelong A13, Katuna
