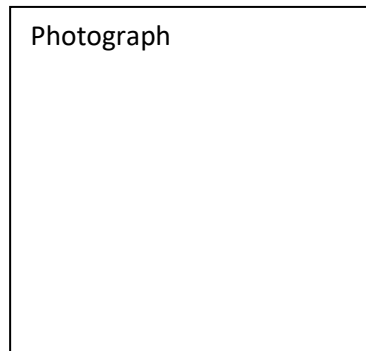

Christopher WILSON was one of five surviving children of Walter WILSON, from Hardingstone, once a labourer at the water works and later a motor fitter, and his wife Emily, from Oxford originally, a laundress.

No specific service record or Medal Index Card attributable to this man has been found, though the name occurs frequently in records. Because of his youth, if conscripted at all, he may never have left the mainland anyway, so not qualifying for any service medals.

In 1925 Christopher married Annie DYKE, five years his junior, in Towcester. By 1939 the couple were living in Roade and he was employed as a Foreman Storekeeper in a heavy engineering business.

Annie's death was registered in September 1974 and Christopher's in June 1978, both at Northampton.
