He volunteered in November 1915, and on completing a period of training in the following year was drafted to India, whence he proceeded later to Mesopotamia. Whilst in this theatre of Operations he was engaged on important duties at Amara, Kut, Bagdad and other stations, finally returning home for demobilisation in June 1919. He holds the General Service and Victory Medals.

Frederick Edwin Barnes was the son of Fred and Elizabeth Lucas Barnes. In 1901 Fred senior was baker, grocer and beer retailer in Bugbrooke and by 1911 was a Master Baker. His son was following him into the trade and was listed in the census as a journeyman baker.

Fred Erick enlisted in November 1914 and joined the Army Service Corp. At the end of the war he was a Private in the Base Support Depot with Service Number 157714.
