George TURLAND was one of eight surviving children of Joseph TURLAND, a farm labourer, and his wife Betsy, living in Chapel Yard in 1911.

Any military service is not confirmed; a George TURLAND, attributed to Bugbrooke, served in the Northumberland Fusiliers, but his age at enlistment in October 1914 was noted as 23, so it is unlikely to be the same man, even allowing for a little embellishment by George and an official 'blind eye' (and is more likely a record transcription error). There are several medal records in the name, but no other personal information.

[George's older brothers Joseph and Thomas did serve in the Army – see their separate data sheets].

Amy died in late 1948, aged 51, and George died on 27 July 1964 in Northampton General Hospital.
