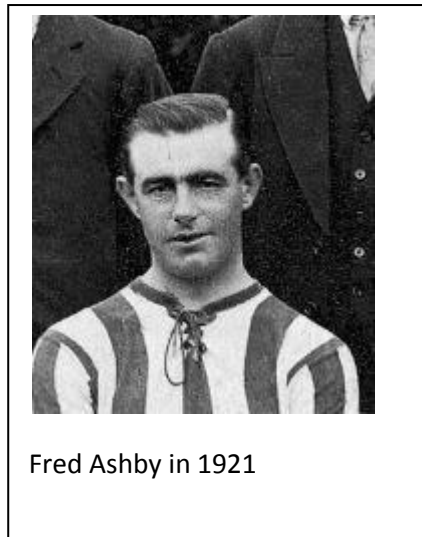

<i>Additional Information</i>

Frederick ASHBY was one of two children – and the only son – of George ASHBY, a Platelayer for the LNWR and his wife, Elizabeth.

He may have enlisted towards the end of the war, but because of his youth, probably did not serve outside the UK and therefore has no medal entitlement.

A number of Medal Index Cards exist in this name, though none are a good match for his alleged service, as 66089, Private, 52nd (Graduated) Battalion, the Bedfordshire Regiment. [This battalion was created from an earlier Training Reserve battalion, on 27 October 1917 at Colchester in Essex. It moved to Norwich in February 1918, to Taverham in May and back to Norwich in the Autumn, never leaving the UK].

No relevant Service Record has been found.

The death on 2 May 1962 of a Frederick ASHBY aged 61 is registered at Brixworth, noting a home address of 27 Kislingbury Road.
